Re: Funding Opportunities for Energy Efficiency and Resiliency

Colleagues:

In August I shared information about direct/elective pay in a memo. Below is additional information along with resources. Reach out with any questions any time. Also, **please keep us updated if you are pursuing any federal monies.**

Elective Pay or Direct Pay: like tax credits, but for local governments and nonprofits

- 1. It appears that the most applicable projects in our region would be for EV fleet transition, EV charging placement, and solar projects (rooftop solar on municipal buildings, community solar, and solar farms). A technical list of credits and deductions (qualifying projects) can be found here.
- 2. You could get up to 70% of your qualifying project costs paid for! The base tax credits amount is generally 6% with more information available here. Bonus credits are available for:
 - a. <u>prevailing wage and apprenticeship</u> (if standards are met, base becomes 30%)
 - b. <u>domestic content</u> (10% and phases down for facilities beginning construction in 2024 or later)
 - c. energy communities (up to 10%)
 - d. <u>low-income communities</u> (10-20%, requires pre-application)
- 3. Credits are based on the total project cost (not just the local government's out-of-pocket costs) so this can be stacked with other funding options like grants and loans.
- 4. There is no cap on the credits you can claim, as long as the criteria are met and process followed.
- 5. Resources:

- 6. Deadlines vary for bonus credits, submittal of tax return depends on when the project is put into service.
